- Teaching and supervising graduate and undergraduate students at HfP/GOV
- Interdisciplinary research at the intersection between Politics and Technology, which includes joint publications and the preparation of grant applications
- Support of the chair on administrative, research, and teaching related issues

Qualifications:

- Outstanding graduate or doctoral degree in Political Science or Economics
- Excellent academic record with relevant high-level publications
- Academic advising and teaching experience
- Ability to work in an international team
- English language proficiency
- Sufficient language skills in German for independent teaching
- Successful record in third-party funding acquisition is an asset

Salary will be paid according to remuneration level 13 of the wage agreement for public service in the federal states (TV-L13).
