Salary will be paid according to remuneration level 13 of the wage agreement for public service in the federal states (TV-L13). The post is **full-time** on a fixed term contract for **3 years** (with the possibility of prolongation). Applicants with disabilities will be given preferential treatment if qualifications are by and large equal. The Bavarian School of Public Policy seeks to increase the number of women in areas in which they are underrepresented. Therefore, we particularly encourage qualified women to apply.
